


First Semester Feedback Survey

HAYDI Provides Food to Wild Animals

Extreme cold weather in eastern Turkey has made it difficult for wildlife in the region to find food. The Animal Condition Monitoring Department (HAYDI) and Gendarmerie Search and Rescue (JAK) teams have been dispatched to Elazığ to help feed the animals.

HAYDI is a mobile reporting application created to prevent crimes against the environment, nature, and animals. It is available both in Apple Store and Play Store, and you can log in by typing your foreigner ID number and date of birth. After you enter the verification code sent to your mobile phone, the app will be activated. You can also attach a photo to your report through the application.

On July 28, the Turkish Ministry of the Interior assigned HAYDI to take care of the animals.
